The President's Message

It is with great pleasure that we present to you once again our annual report. As we ushered in 2017 we had a general election that saw our entire executive re-elected. We welcome our newest Patron Hon. Denis Sozi Galabuzi State Minister for Luwero triangle who joins our other distinguished Patrons General Kale Kayihura, IGP and Major General Muhozi Kinerugaba.

The NOC was fortunate enough to enhance its co-operation with The French Embassy (France-Uganda Friendship Week) and the Italian Embassy (celebrating Olympic day). These two unique partnerships enabled us to use sport and diplomacy to enhance our youth. We managed to double our efforts in capacity building

by training more than 250 sports administrators and surpassing the record number of commission activities held in a calendar year which was a benchmark for the IOC. We plan to enhance our administrative capacity by launching the UOC/CGA online administrative management system that will host all our member federations giving them free connectivity and usage. Our online management system is a benchmark for the IOC and will probably be the first in the world linking the NOC with all its member federations.

Internationally we began to show our true potential at the world games. We won a silver and bronze at the Islamic Solidarity Games in Baku and went on to surprisingly win gold at the Youth Commonwealth games in the Bahamas. 2018 poses even a bigger challenge as we prepare for three international competitions (Youth All Africa games Algiers, Youth Olympic Games Buenos Aires and the Commonwealth Games Gold Coast) with an ever bigger expectation to better our previous performances.

At continental level we managed to host the 2nd International Sports Law and OVEP 2.0 Training workshop. In 2018 we plan to surpass this by hosting RADO conference, ANOCA Executive Board meeting, 3rd Edition International Sports Law, Zone 5 General Assembly and Commonwealth Games Ambassador Cathy Freeman.

As we ended 2017 we sadly lost our brother, friend and fellow sports administrator Mr. Godfrey Nuwagaba. He has left an ever lasting legacy having given guidance as a personal manager to our 2nd ever Olympic gold medalist (London 2012 Marathon) Mr. Steven Kiprotich.

On a personal note I would like to thank all the eleven Zone five countries that elected me Zone 5 President unopposed. A special thank you to the IOC President Dr Thomas Bach for appointing me on the IOC Marketing Commission and the ANOCA President General Lassana Palenfo for also appointing me to the ANOCA Games Coordination Commission.

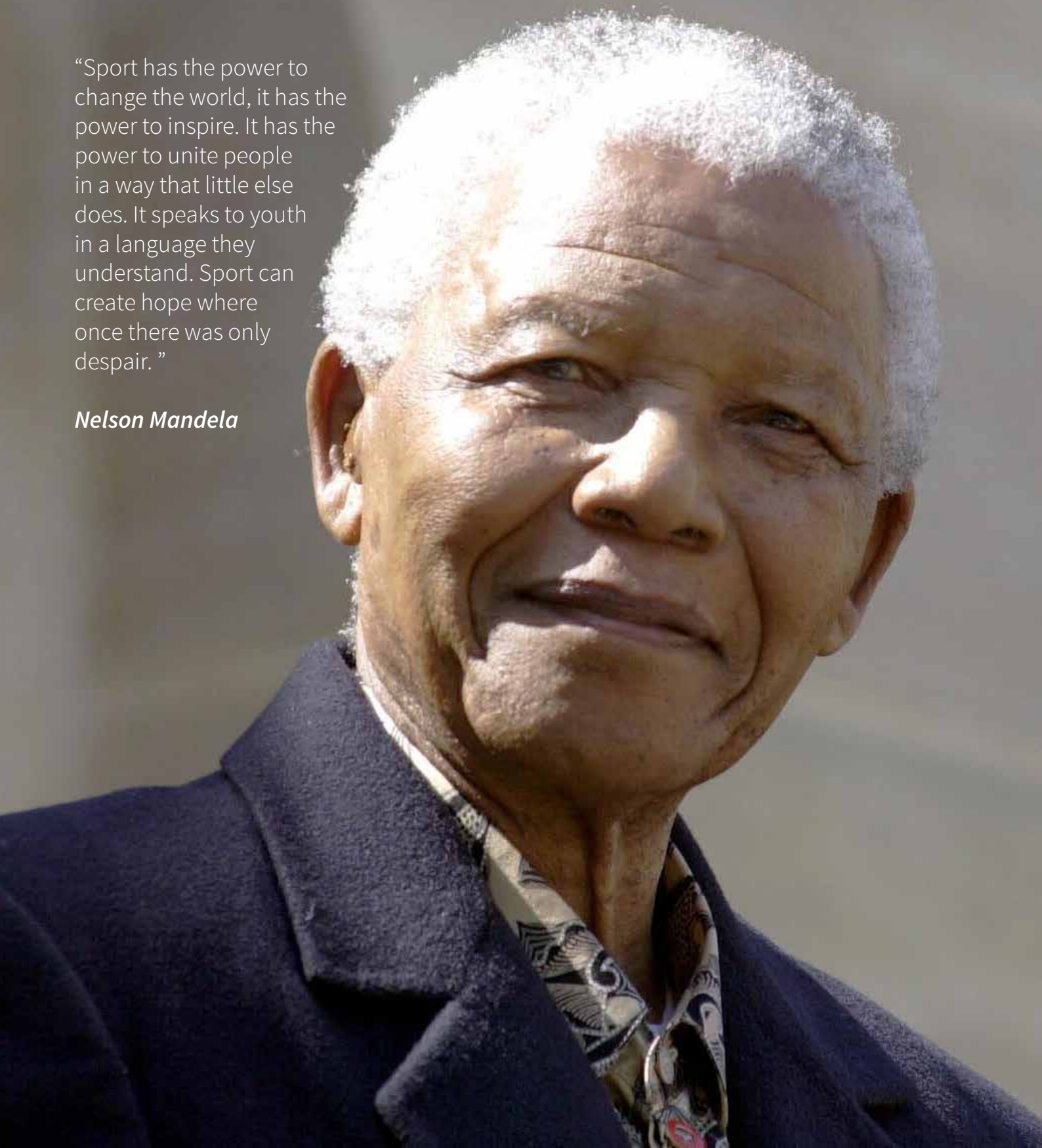

The 2017 annual report provides a comprehensive account of the key activities undertaken, major milestones achieved, and the planned activities for 2018.

The report outlines the of the activities of the UOC which include, the operations of the UOC secretariat, update on programs under the Olympic Solidarity program, interaction with member national federations/associations, collaboration linkages with strategic partners, international appointments, participation in international and regional conferences, preparation for various international games, anti-doping and strategic planning for the UOC. One of the key highlights in 2017 which is reflected in the report is the election of a new executive committee in January as well as hosting the 2nd International Sports law seminar that brought together 14 African National Olympic Committees in Kampala. The UOC commissions implemented several activities aimed at promoting Olympic values and education across the country.

UOC continued to deepen its footprint on the international scene as illustrated in the various for a attended and highlighted in this report. In addition the UOC Constitution was revised and amended during the year. We provided extensive comments and input to the draft Physical Activity and Sports Bill 2017 that is being drafted by the Ministry of Education and Sports.

The report concludes by looking ahead to 2018 which is going to see Uganda participating in several international games such as the Commonwealth Games in Gold Coast, the African Youth Game in Algiers as well as the Youth Olympics in Buenos Aires Argentina. The UOC executive committee going forward in 2018 will continue to strive for excellence and ensuring that the best interest of the athletes remains central to our mission and work.

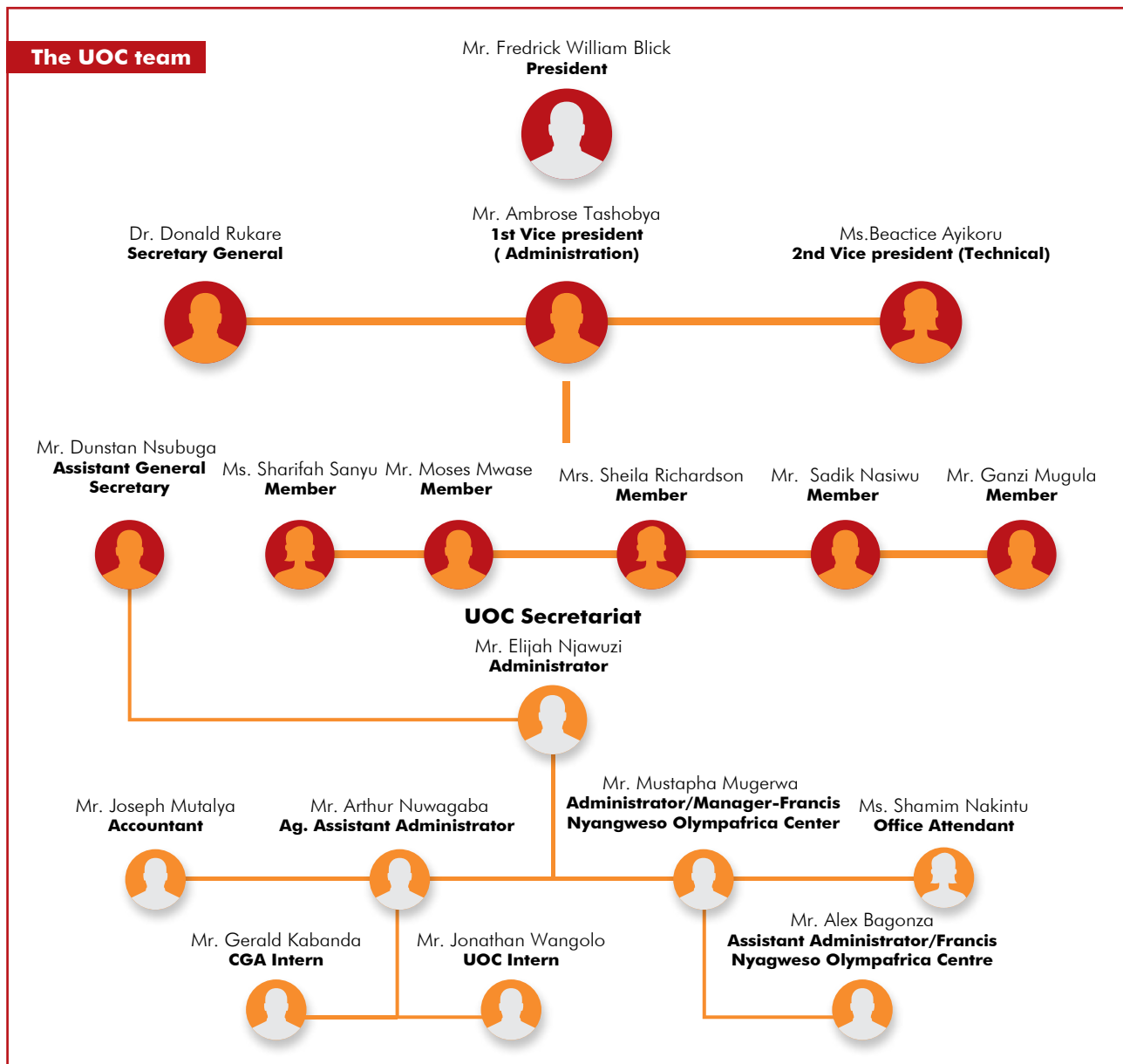

Introduction

2017 commenced with an elective Annual General Assembly at which a new executive committee was elected for the 2017-2020 period. It was a vibrant year for the Uganda Olympic Committee with several national, regional and international activities participated in. This report therefore highlights the key achievements, milestones in 2017 together with the challenges met. The activities of the UOC have been run by the following key organs:



1. UOC 2017 General Assembly

The UOC Annual General Assembly (AGM) was held on 28th January 2017. The AGM which was elective as well as attended by members of the UOC. During the assembly the 2016 annual report, audit report, financial report 2016, 2017 budget and calendar were presented and approved. An election was held under the stewardship of the Returning Officer Mr. Sim Katende. A new executive was elected. The IOC and ANOCA were informed and have since recognized the new team. 2. UOC Council Meetings

3. UOC Extraordinary General Assembly

The UOC held an extra ordinary general assembly on 1st October 2017 at which the UOC Constitution was amended. The revised constitution has been forwarded to the International Olympic Committee for approval.

6. Promoting Olympism in Society

Promoting Olympic Values and Olympism remains a core Strategic priority of the UOC, and stands as our Strategic priority #5 within the NOC's Strategic Plan 2015 – 2020. This appreciation is not only derived from our Constitution, but most importantly from the Olympic Charter, and particularly Rule 27 which defines the mission of NOCs 'to develop, promote and protect the Olympic Movement in their respective Countries, in accordance with the Olympic Charter. Thanks to the IOC/Olympic Solidarity, and our various members who constitute our Commissions, the UOC embraced its great social and moral responsibility of promoting Olympic Values through the following programmes;

- i.) Celebrations to mark the Olympic Day
- ii.) Culture and Olympic Education Programmes
- iii.) Gender Equality and Diversity in Sport Programmes.
- iv.) Sport for Social Development Programmes;
- v.) Sports Medicine and the Protection of Clean Athletes; and
- vi.) Sustainability in Sport Programmes;

Olympic Day 2016

The UOC joined the rest of the World to celebrate the Olympic Day 2016, under the theme 'Move, Learn and Discover. The weekly celebration, which included visiting various Schools and communities, was crowned on 23 June 2017 at Luigi Giussani High School, in Kampala. As the theme suggests, the Olympic Day was dedicated to getting everyone '**Move**', i.e. get active, '**Learn**' learn about the Olympic Values and the true spirit of Sport, and '**Discover**' discover new Sports.

The event was graced by H.E. Domenico Fornana, Ambassador of Italy to Uganda, who presided over the occasion as Chief Guest. H.E. Fornana was joined by Mr William Blick, President UOC, and other UOC Executive Committee members, Presidents and Secretaries General of various National Sports Federations, Olympians, and over 700 celebrants from various Schools and communities.

Culture and Olympic Education Programmes

Inculcating Olympism and its' values took centre stage in 2017, with the UOC reaching our directly to over 1,000 young people with the Olympic spirit through educational activities. This represent a 20% increase in our impact, leveraging the true spirit of Sport among the young people in Uganda.

Olympic Values Literacy Initiative 2017

The third edition of our annually held Olympic Values Literacy Initiative 2017 aimed at using the educational activities of debate, literature including poem and essay writing, Art etc. to inculcate the values of Olympism, through enabling the young people to share, interact and challenge each other about the values of Olympism. The Initiative includes seven (7) educational activities including the;



- i.) Olympic Values Literature Contest;
- ii.) Olympic Values Art and Sport Contest;
- iii.) Olympic Values Junior Debate Championships;
- iv.) Olympic Values Debate Championships; and
- v.) National Symposium on Olympic Values 2017.

Captivating about the year's edition was the National Symposium on Olympic Values 2017 held on 26 March 2017 at GEMS Cambridge International School Kampala. The event was graced with welcoming the Queen's Baton Relay (QBR) of the XXI Commonwealth Games which will take place in Gold Coast, Queensland, Australia between April 2018. The QBR represents the relay around the world held prior beginning of the Commonwealth Games. Participants including students and pupils from various Schools were privileged to share moments with the QBR, prior

embarking the business of the Symposium whose theme rotated around integrating Olympic values education within the Schools' Physical education and Sports programmes.

The event was graced by Louis Martin CBE, Mr Simon Gideon CGF President and Vice President respectively, Mr John Bosco Onyik, Chairperson – National Council of Sports, H.E. John Feakas, Australian High Commissioner accredited to Uganda, Mr William Frederick Blick, President, UOC and CGA – Uganda among others.

Olympic Values Education Programme 2.0 Training Workshop

2016 by the IOC Public Affairs and Social Development through Sport Department, the UOC dedicated the post-Olympic year 2017's education programmes towards building capacity in OVEP delivery and implementation. Between 06 – 08 September 2017, the UOC convened up to 100 participants, including Officials from nine (9) National Olympic Committees across Africa, Physical Education Teachers and Coaches from up to fifty (50) Schools, two (2) refugees (Refugee Community Sports Leaders) belonging to the Refugee Settlement Areas of Nakivale and Kiryandongo. This was at the OVEP 2.0 Training Workshop held at Kampala Parents' School.

Gender Equality and Diversity in Sport Programmes

The UOC acknowledges the plight of the women and minorities within the Sports community in Uganda today, which has been characterized by discrimination, all of which robs the identity of Sport as a human right, according to the fundamental principles of Olympism (principle #4). In this regard, 2017 saw the UOC embark on implementing strategies aimed at promoting

gender equality, integration and diversity in sports and sports governance. Commencing the year, the UOC re-energized by instituting a Gender Equality and Diversity Commission, including seven (7) members, to focus on overseeing this great responsibility on its' behalf.

Women's Day

On 3 March 2017, the UOC through its' Gender Equality and Diversity in Sport Commission joined the rest of the world to celebrate the International Women's Day, at an occasion held at Bugema University under the theme **'Women** in the changing World of Work'. The event convened over 500 people, led by prominent Olympians Dorcus Inzikuru, and commenced with Symposium at which women deliberated on various topics seeking to create equality in Sports and sports governance in Uganda. Later on, participants engaged in fun sports games, and the day was crowned by the presentation of certificates and official closure by the Chief Guest Mr William Blick, UOC President, and Patrick Manu, Bugema University Vice Chancellor.

Women in Sport Apprentices Programme

In a bid to bring about diversity in Sport and empower women to attain senior leadership positions within the national Sports structures, the UOC through its' Gender Equality and Diversity in Sport Commission selected up to 50 women to engage in this Project. The Project placed women to serve under the administrations of various Sports Federations, and particularly in the offices of the senior leaders so as to learn hands-on, on how to manage and govern a Sports Organisation. The Project was concluded with a Mentorship and Evaluation Workshop held on 29 September – 01 October 2017 in Kampala.

Sport for Social Development Programmes

Belonging to the Olympic Movement makes us appreciate the goal of Olympism which is **to place Sport at the service of the harmonious development of humankind, with a view of promoting a peaceful society concerned with the preservation of human dignity.** The UOC further appreciates Recommendation

#23 of the IOC Olympic Agenda 2020, which looks at having the Olympic Movement fully engage with the Communities, in a bid to use Sport to leverage social change in society. To achieve the above, the UOC through its' Sport for Social Development Commission implemented various activities;

Uganda France Friendship Week 2017

While appreciating the long friendship and a shared history between Uganda and France, the UOC appreciates the long tradition that exists between the Olympic movement and France. The UOC hence joined its' partner the Embassy of France to Uganda to jointly organise the Uganda France Friendship Week 2017 between 18 - 25 March 2017. The Week greatly bridged the UOC, France and the community, proving the power of Sport, culture and society.

The full week of friendship commenced with the celebrations marking the Francophonie Day on 18 March 2017, at École Française Les Grands Lacs,

Lugogo, at which the French community in Uganda shared friendly pleasant moments together. On 20 March, the Tourism and Environment Day was hosted by H.E. Stéphanie Rivoal at the Embassy Residence, Nakasero, and was dedicated to promotion of sustainable development and strengthening of the partnership between France and Uganda in the tourism industry. This was followed by the Goût de France on 21 March 2017 which welcomed up to 170 guests to enjoy the Gastronomic French and Ugandan recipe. On 22 March 2017, at Makerere University, the student community and the general public was welcomed for the Academics Day which focused on sharing political views and experiences between Uganda and France through media and politics, and youth and politics. With the arrival of the French Military football team to Uganda for the Friendship Week, the French military joined by the Ugandan military for the Defense Day on 23 March, which was dedicated to celebrating the

combined effort in contributing towards regional peace by both institutions. On 24 March 2017, the Sports Day saw the French Military football team join the Uganda Cranes (Uganda National Football Team) to join the community and celebrate Sport together by visiting Schools with disadvantaged children to share sports equipment, and engage in fun sports activities. The Day also featured a Kids' Tournament at the Mandela National Stadium.

Captivating about the Week was the final day on 25 March 2017 which saw the Fitness Campaign which welcomed over 3,000 people, to engage in physical activity, and fun events. As part of the Campaign, a fun run was held around the Kireka community. The day was crowned with a friendly match between the Uganda Cranes Vs the French Military Football Team, and ultimately a Musical and cultural festival.

Bi-annual National Conference on Sport for Social Development

Held between 29 – 31 March 2017 at the Imperial Royale Hotel, Kampala, the 1st Biannual National Conference on Sport for Social Development gathered eighty (80) delegates from various organisations, ranging from Civil society organisations, the public sector, coupled with National Sports Federations to deliberate on the using Sport as a tool for addressing social challenges in Uganda.

The Conference was officially opened by H.E Stéphanie Rivoal, Ambassador of France to Uganda, on 29 March. Among the presenters at the Conference were Mr Omara Apitta, Commissioner of Physical Education and Sports, Brig. Phinelas M. Katarima, Chief of Education, Sports and Culture, Uganda Peoples' Defence Forces (UPDF), Ms Rosie Agoi, UNATCOM Secretary General, among others. The delegates resolved on a resolution bearing 13 recommendations through which Sport in Uganda can be used to address the various social challenges affecting Uganda, and society today.

Fitness Campaign 2017

The UOC realizes the inactive lifestyles of millions of Ugandans, and also acknowledged the power of Sport in mobilizing and sensitizing masses to live active and health lifestyles. The UOC further realizes the power of Sport in addressing the plights of the refugee community. The UOC hence used its' Fitness Campaign to contribute towards restoring hope, preventing idleness, reduce frustration and restoration of a sense of normalcy among the tens of thousands of People of Concern, especially those in the Settlement Areas, and also in the other dimension, advocate for active lifestyles among the urban dwellers.

Our Fitness Campaign saw three (3) events, including the one at the Kiryandongo Refugee Settlement which was held on 18 July 2017, to jointly mark the Nelson Mandela International Day. Our second Campaign was dedicated to using Sport as a means of fighting crime in society, through bridging the gap between Uganda Police Force and the community.

Sports Medicine and Protection of Clean Athletes Programmes

In fulfillment of priority #2 of our Strategic Plan 2015 – 2020, the UOC continues to place Athletes at the centre of the Ugandan sports community. This post-Olympic year saw us stage the National Conference on the Protection of Clean Athletes which was held on under theme 'Placing the Athlete at the Centre of the Olympic Movement in Uganda'.

National Conference on the Protection of Clean Athletes

The event convened up to 80 participants including Athletes representatives, player's intermediaries, Sports Federations officials who discussed about a wide array of topics affecting the Athletes community today, including doping, sexual and gender based violence in Sport, discrimination and racism, competition fixing, among others.

Hepatitis B Vaccination

The UOC in conjunction with its' partners the AAR Services Uganda, administered a series of Hepatitis B tests and vaccination campaigns, all aimed at having an HB free Athlete community in Uganda.

Sustainability in Sports Programmes

The UOC remains committed to incorporating sustainability principles into its' working policies and working methods, so as to inspire adoption of sustainability principles within the Ugandan Sports community. The UOC further acknowledges the role Sport can play in raising awareness about environmental sustainability principles, and sustainable development in general.

Sustainable Tourism in Sport Initiative

The year 2017 was declared the UN International Year for Sustainable Tourism for Development. Appreciating the role Sport can play in realizing sustainable tourism, the UOC staged a Workshop on Sport for Sustainable Tourism between 05 – 06 June 2017 in Hoima.

Participants were trained on using Sport as a means of promoting and championing Sustainable tourism.

The event was privileged to welcome Owek. Norman Lukumu, the Royal Katikiro of Bunyoro-Kitara Kingdom who officially opened the Workshop and commended the role of Sport in contributing towards tourism. The Workshop also coincided with the World Environment Day celebrations, and the hence the UOC used it to join the rest of the world to mark these celebrations.

7. Athletes Commission

The Athletes' Commission this year held the 2nd Athlete Career Programme (ACP) on 20th July 2017 at the Sheraton Kampala Hotel. Mr. Mugula Ganzi Semu OLY the Athletes' Chairman was the Facilitator for the ACP being assisted by Kadiatou Kanoute OLY from Mali. It was the second time Kadiatou had been to Uganda to deliver this programme. Mugula Ganzi is now a recognized IOC ACP Facilitator which he trained for while in Cape Verde earlier this year. The commission in coming year will be involved in a pilot project with the Olympians Association to mentor Olympians on transitioning from active sport life.

The Uganda Olympians Association (UOA), has this year embarked on visiting all its Olympians where they reside to find out on well-being and making UOA known to them. The UOA is now working with IOC, WOA and the NOC to deliver the Pilot project to mentor Olympians on transitioning from active sport life. Mr Mugula Ganzi Semu OLY (President UOA), Mr. Musonge Moses OLY (Secretary UOA) and Mr Otim Joel OLY will be acting as the Mentors in this project. Uganda is only African Country that has been targeted for this project which is a plus for our leadership and the NOC. Following the election of the Athletes Commission

members in September, two slots remain to be filled to bring the number to 8.

8. UOC Strategic Plan 2015-2020

The UOC strategic Plan 2015-2020 provides direction and guidance to all our activities. All the activities carried out in 2017 were aligned to the plan.

9. Interaction with National Federations/Associations

The UOC President William Blick attended the Uganda Table Tennis Association Annual General Assembly, 29 January 2017. A new executive committee led by President Jaggwe was elected.

In addition the UOC President William Blick attended the elective Annual General Assembly of the Uganda Swimming Federation at which a new executive committee led by Dr. Donald Rukare was elected.

The UOC Secretary General attended the elective Annual General Assembly of the Uganda Hockey



Association, where a new executive was elected under the new leadership of Ms. Dhamuzungu Lydia Sanyu.

The Uganda Shooting Federation (USF) held a General Assembly on 8th May 2017, at which Ann Mugoma was elected as the new President. The Uganda Rowing Federation held an elective Annual General Assembly on 13 May 2017, at which Hamza Kahwa was elected as President.

The UOC Vice President Ambrose Tasobya attended a workshop on developing a national sports system (DSS) held by the Uganda Rowing Federation on 20-22 July 2017.

UOC President William Blick attended a press conference at which equipment was handed over to the Uganda Fencing Association.

Preparations for the Winter Games 2018 hit a snag as the potential athlete Brolin Maweje has indicated that qualification for the games may not be possible. The OS awarded a scholarship to Brolin Mwenje to enable him prepare and try to qualify for the upcoming 2018 Winter Olympic Games which may now have to be deferred or cancelled.

The African Youth Games will take place in Algiers Algeria 17- 29 July 2018.

The Youth Olympic Games will take place in Buenos Aires 6-18 October 2018.

The Uganda Olympic Committee (UOC) in its' capacity as the Commonwealth Games Association of Uganda was proud to welcome the Gold Coast 2018 Queen's Baton Relay (QBR). Launched on the Commonwealth Day, 13 March 2017 by Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II, the Gold Coast 2018 QBR was in Uganda between 25 – 29 March 2017, on its' 388 days journey visiting every nation and territory of the Commonwealth, before the Opening Ceremony of the XXI Commonwealth Games on 4 April 2018 in Gold Coast, Queensland AUS.

The three (3) day festivities commenced with a Media Conference on 25 March 2017 which was saw Mr William Blick, CGA President officially welcome the Baton to Uganda, and also welcome Ms Loius Martin CBE and

Mr Gideon Sam, President and Vice President of the Commonwealth Games Federation (CGF), Mr Gideon Sam respectively. On the 26 March, the Children and Youth were priviledged to share Moments with at GEMS Cambridge International School Kampala, before the QBR was rallied to the occasion of the 35th IAAF World Cross Country Championships 2017 in Kololo. On 28 March 2017, the QBR was then presented to Hon. Janet Museveni, First Lady and Minister of Education and Sports, at the State House Nakasero, and later on to the Parliament of Uganda, where it was welcomed by Members of Parliament (MPs) led by the Rt Hon Rebecca Alitwala Kadaga, Speaker of Parliament. The Baton was then presented to H.E. Edward Kiwanuka Ssekandi, Vice President of the Republic of Uganda, at the Office of the President Building in Kampala. Concluding the festivities was a dinner hosted by the Australian High Commissioner accredited to the Republic of Uganda, which was hosted at Protea Hotel Kampala.

Uganda is set to join the rest of the Commonwealth to celebrate the Commonwealth Games in Gold Coast from the 4 – 15 April 2018.

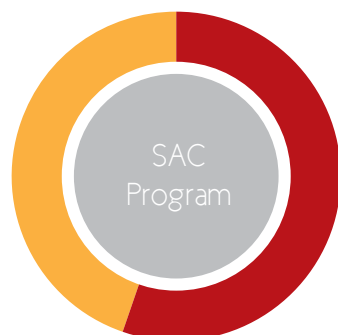
15. Capacity building

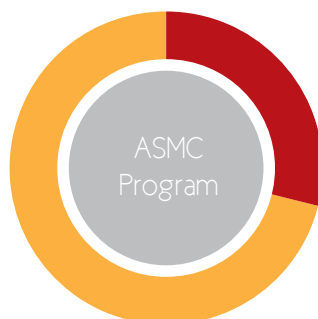

- ➔ UOC Administrators Elijah Njawuzi and Uganda Hockey Association Phillip Wafula have completed a sports administrator's course in Leipzig University. They both have returned to Uganda.
- ➔ Mr. Peter Mugisha of swimming pursued an international program under the International Enrichment Coaching Program (IECP) and completed in May 2017.

- ➔ A Sports Administrators Course (SAC) for the media is planned in the coming months.
- ➔ The 2nd graduation ceremony for 369 SAC students, 69 ASMC students together with those that have completed their studies from abroad will be held on 30th June 2017.
- ➔ Candidates for ITK Coaches program in Germany (Leonard Lubambula- Rugby) PAISAC – coaches course in Canada (Albert Aciko –Basketball), ICECP in US (Bwesigye Nason- Volleyball), MEMOS (Annet Nakamya UOC Women and Sports Commission) and Olympic Masters Cologne (Elijah Njawuzi – UOC, from last year). Olympic Masters Greece (Hilda Nshuti- UOC Sustainability in Sports Commission, Matsyetsye Emmanuel –Table Tennis) have been received. Priority will be given to those that have completed Sports Administrators Course (SAC) and the Advanced Sports Management Courses (ASMC) as well as UOC Ex.com members.
- ➔ Mr. Dunstan K. Nsubuga, UOC Assistant Secretary General has completed his Executive Masters in Sports Management (MEMOS) program.
- ➔ Mr. Moses Mwase, UOC Executive Committee member/Head Legal Commission with the support of the UOC, has completed an Executive Masters in Sports Law at ISDE.
- ➔ A Sports Administrators Course (SAC) was held at Watoto Church from October 2017
- ➔ The Advanced Sports Management Course (ASMC) for Women which commenced on 27th May 2017 and concluded in November 2017.
- ➔ The 2 Advanced Sports Management Course (ASMC) which started on 10th June 2017 ended in November 2017.
- ➔ Annette Nakamya took part in the Badminton World Federation (BWF) level 2 certified coaches course in Lugogo in November 2017.
- ➔ A Sports Administrators Course (SAC) for executive committee members of National Federations was held in 1-3 December 2017

16. Update on National Council of Sports, Ministry of Education and Sports – UOC situation

Following months of discussions and negotiations between NCS, MOES and UOC a MoU was signed on 24 May 2017. The MoU which was witnessed by the Honorable Minister of State for Sports paves the way for a cordial working relationship between the agencies. It was agreed that, all parties would respect the roles and mandates of each other, NCS recognizes the UOC Executive elected 28th January 2017, UOC would revise its Constitution to align it to the Laws of Uganda within three months, subsequent UOC elections would be held under the revised Constitution. A detailed MoU spelling out the roles and mandates of each agencies would be concluded.

17. Draft Physical Activity and Sports Bill 2017

The Ministry of Education and Sports (MOES) has prepared a draft Physical Education and Sports Bill 2017. The proposed Act seeks to provide for the National Council of Sports, establishment of a sports development fund, establishment of the Uganda

Sports Institute, administration and management of sports in the country, to provide for all aspects of physical activity and sports, including individual and mass physical activity, physical education, organized and informal sports, competitive and non-competitive sports, health club activity, professional sports and any other emerging form of physical activity or sports, repeal the National Council of Sports Act Cap 48 and for any other related matters. We held a consultative meeting with members on 8th June 2017. We have submitted consolidated views and comments on the bill from members with MOES and the UOC met with the drafting team in August.

18. UOC Constitutional Review Process

The UOC Constitutional Review Commission following appointment by the UOC Executive Committee

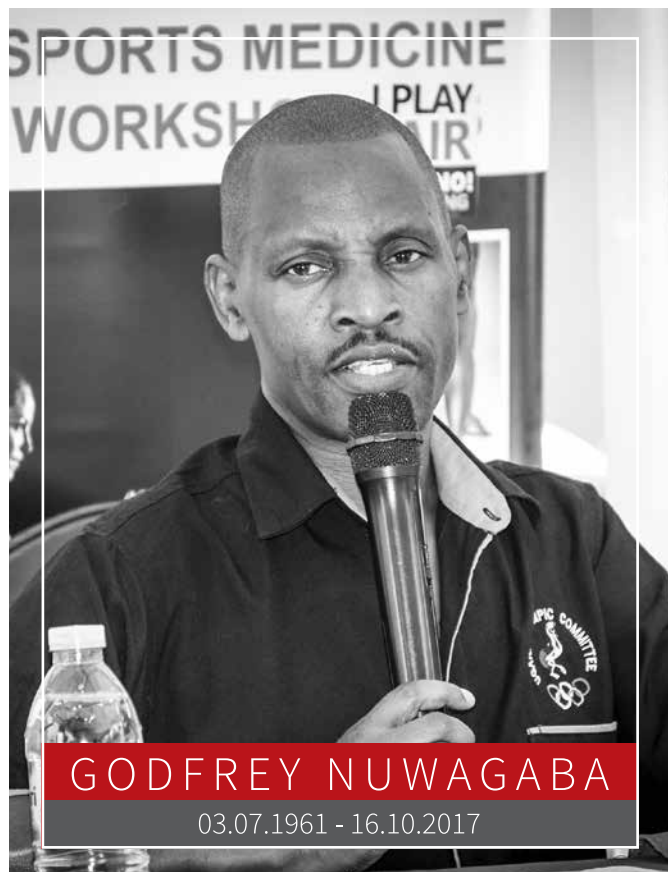
commenced its work in August. The review commission has held several meetings as well as a consultative meeting on 14th August 2017 with UOC members at which views and proposals on various constitutional amendments were made. Further consultation with members will be done during the UOC Council held on 9th September 2017. An Extra Ordinary Assembly to consider and adopt constitutional amendments was held on 16th September 2017 at the UOC. The revised constitution which was forwarded to the IOC is still pending approval. The National Council of Sports and Ministry of Education and Sports are also yet to provide their position on the revised constitution which was forwarded to them.

19. Hosting of the 2 International Sports Law Program 24-26 November 2017

The UOC in conjunction with ISDE Madrid Spain with support from the Olympic Solidarity hosted the 2nd International Sports Law Program at the Sheraton Kampala Hotel. 24-26 November 2017. The program was attended by 16 African NOCs and 30 national participants drawn from national associations, national council of sports and the Ministry of Justice and Constitutional Affairs.

20. Obituaries

During the year, we lost two prominent members of the UOC family. Mr. Micheal Mungoma, the President of the Uganda Shooting Federation died on 17th March 2017. On October 16th 2017 the UOC Treasurer Godfrey Nuwagaba tragically passed away on a flight en-route to Dubai. He was laid to rest on 20th October 2017 and may his gentle soul rest in eternal peace.



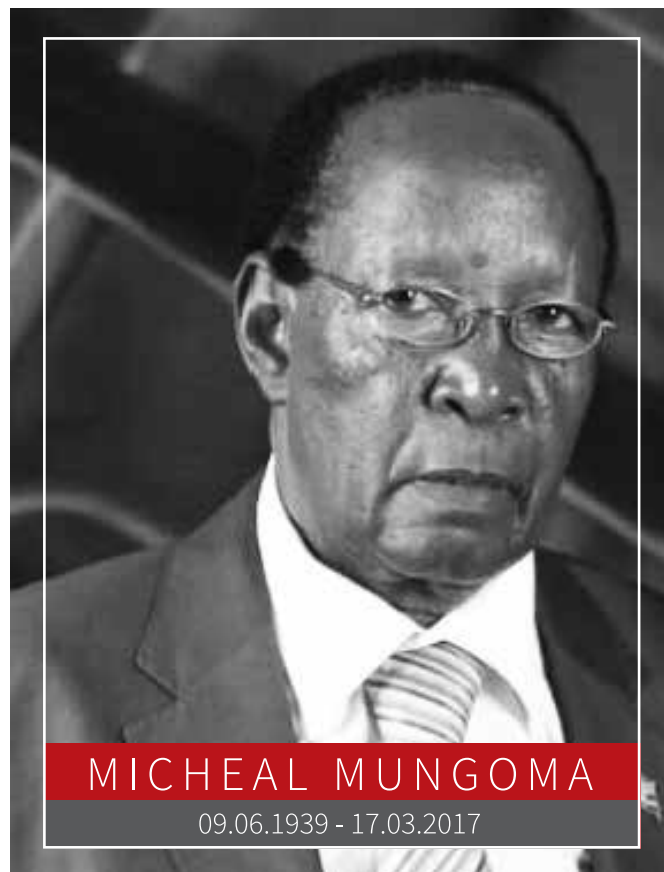
21. 2018 Calendar
