Our constitution should be upheld for its unique values and better governace principles. A closer working relationship with Hon. Hamson Obua State Minister For Sports Ministry Of Education and Sports should not be taken for granted but should be fully utilised to enhance the sporting sector and Olympic movement in Uganda. We thank him for his commitment to the Olympic family.

I would like to convey my sincere gratitute and appreciation to my dear friend and colleague Dr Thomas Bach IOC President for believing in me and nominating me to become an IOC Member. It is without any doubt the biggest recognition I could have ever recieved as a sports administrator. I do hereby commit to serve the Olympic movement for life!

2020 started off with much promise and anticipation. Our annual calendar was laden with national, regional and international activities. We hosted for the first time ever the Association of National Olympic Committees of Africa (ANOCA) executive board meeting here in Kampala as well as a teams from the International Olympic Committee, Olympic Refugee Foundation and Olympafrica. We were honored to have President Yoweri Museveni bestowed with the highest ANOCA order of merit award. Our very own UOC President and IOC Members was the recipient of the ANOCA merit award. We looked forward with anticipation to participating in the Tokyo 2020 Olympics with 19 athletes qualified for the games at the time. However in March, the corona virus (COVID-19) arrived on our shores with a bang and

to date has not left. COVID-19 caused untold disruption causing the halting of all sporting activities for most part of 2020. National, regional and international leagues were stopped and competitions including the Tokyo 2020 Olympics postponed to 2021.

Responding to the new reality occasioned by the COVID-19, we were able to transition to operating online. We were able hold our monthly executive committee meetings, council meetings, an extra ordinary general assemblies, engagements with our membership as well as participate in international activities such as meetings with the IOC and Commonwealth Games Federation all virtually. 
Executive Summary

The 2020 annual report provides an account of the main activities of the UOC/CGAU carried during the year that was severely disrupted by the corona virus (COVID-19). 2020 which can be best described as the COVID-19 year saw most of our planned activities transition to online. To this end the operations of the UOC secretariat, executive committee meetings, interaction with member national federations/ associations, Olympic Solidarity programs, commission activities and participation in international and regional conferences was done virtual as reported. We prepared for the Tokyo 2020 Olympic Games which were postponed to 2021 due to COVID 19. The report also speaks to the collaboration linkages with strategic partners and the international appointments that our sports administrator hold.

During the year, the UOC hosted for the first time ever the Association of National Olympic Committees of Africa (ANOCA) executive board meeting here in Kampala as well as a teams from the International Olympic Committee, Olympic Refugee Foundation and Olympafrica. We were honored to have President Yoweri Museveni bestowed with the highest ANOCA order of merit award. Our very own UOC President and IOC Member was the recipient of the ANOCA merit award as highlighted in the report.

Support was provided to our qualified athletes as well. We in joint concert with the National Council of Sports (NCS) co-created the standard operating procedures (SOPs) for the resumption of sports. These paved the way for the conditional resumption of sports in October as indicated in the report.

The report concludes by looking ahead to 2021 which will see the Tokyo 2020 Olympic Game held. It is envisaged that between 25-30 athletes will participate in the games. So far 19 have qualified for the games next year. The UOC/CGAU executive committee remains resolved to strive for excellence and ensuring that the best interest of the athletes remains central to our mission and work. 2021 will also see the UOC/CGAU go to the polls to elect a new executive committee for the 2021-2024 period.



Introduction

The Uganda Olympic Committee (UOC) / Commonwealth Games Association of Uganda (CGAU) in carried out several activities as highlighted below.

1.1. UOC Secretariat

A. Secretariat operations

During the year the secretariat held its weekly meetings and from March these were held online via zoom due to the COVID-19 lock down stay home measures in place. Uganda presently, like the rest of the world is struggling through the corona virus (COVID-19) pandemic. The Ministry of Health announced a number of mitigate measures including stay home orders, a lock down and daily curfew 7pm to 6am. These have been in effect for the month of March.
