President's Word >>

In 2024 we as a team have been able to achieve a number of milestones in line with our Strategic plan. Along the way, we experienced some hurdles as well. Overall, we look back at 2024 with a deep sense of satisfaction and look to 2025 with even more promise. This report provides a deep dive into the year from an operational perspective.

Over the year, we were able to hold close to 98% of the scheduled activities in our 2024 calendar. To this end, all monthly Executive Committee meetings were held as well as the quarterly Council meetings with our members. Our Annual General Assembly was successfully held in March at which we presented our 2023 Annual Report, Financial and Audit Reports, the 2024 Calendar and budget were approved as well. Our Commissions were very active and conducted several activities that inter alia promoted Olympism in the country. Our member Federations/Associations were also active, and we were able to attend some of their activities. These included among others Basketball, Archery, Swimming, Volleyball, Badminton, Netball, Taekwondo, Judo, Rugby, Athletics, Gymnastics, Boxing, Hockey, Table Tennis, and Handball. We held a number engagements with our members including a session on the International Olympic Committee 2025-2028 quadrennial plan.

The Uganda Olympic Committee (UOC)/ Commonwealth Games Uganda (CGU, in partnership with the Uganda Forest Authority (UFA) is going to set up one of the largest Olympic Forests in the Olympic global family. UFA has provided us with over 1500 acres of land in five (5) locations on which the Olympic Forest will be created.

The UOC /CGU in addition actively participated in the National Sports Forums convened by the Minister of State for Sports Honorable Peter Ogwang. We also provided extensive input on the draft National Sports Regulations 2024. We shall continue to engage on this and the implementation of the National Sports Act Cap 151 in the New Year. We call upon our members to take full cognizance of the implementation requirements of the new law and regulations that will be passed early 2025.

We organized national capacity building activities for our members, sports fraternity and beyond. We hosted the President of the International Olympic Committee Dr Thomas Bach as well the President of the Association of National Olympic Committees of Africa Mr. Mustafa Berraf. His visit was seen as a vote of confidence in the operations of the UOC. We in addition hosted an African Olympic Debate attended by Kenya, Lesotho and Uganda. Furthermore we hosted an Africa Law Webinar that attracted participants from Asia, Europe and Africa.

The year 2024 saw the holding of the Paris 2024 Olympic Games. Team Uganda comprised of 25 athletes (13 women and 12 men) wining 2 medals (Gold Joshua Cheptegei 10000m and Peruth Chemutai Silver medal 3000m steeplechase.) and ranked 55th overall and 7th in Africa. Uganda also participated in the Africa Games in Accra Ghana with one of the largest teams in recent history winning 20 medals (4 Gold, 6 Silver and 10 Bronze). Uganda was ranked 13th of 54 Africa countries.

We actively participated in regional and international fora such as the Commonwealth Africa Regional meetings, the Commonwealth Games General Assembly, Association of National Olympic Committees (ANOC) General Assembly, Islamic Sports Solidarity Federation (ISSF) Assembly as well as engagements with the International Olympic Committee (IOC).

We congratulate our members who assumed pivotal roles/positions at regional and international level. We

applaud, Ms. Aya Harriet (member FIG) Simon Peter Komaceh Vice President Modern Pentathlon Africa, Sadik Nassiwu Zone 3 Africa Volley Federation and Ms. Beatrice Ayikoru member of Glasgow 2025 Commonwealth Games Reference Group.

We are still trying to secure land to construct our office and the second OlympiAfrica center. This remains a major area of focus for us going forward. Broadening our partnership base and resource mobilization will be a further area of focus.

Looking at 2025, we shall focus on implementing our Strategic Plan and holding our elective annual general assembly in March.

I would like to thank my colleagues on the UOC /CGU Executive Committee for their unwavering commitment and guidance. Our staff at the Secretariat for their amazing hard work and resilience. Members of the UOC commissions, our member Federations/Associations, the Government of Uganda, Ministry of Education and Sports, National Council of Sports, partners and media for their support.

We look forward to our continued collaboration. We firmly believe that 2025 will be a year full of sporting promise and activity. We remain committed to serving our members and the athletes to ensure that sports made in Uganda continues to soar even higher.

Secretary General's Word >>

The Uganda Olympic Committee (UOC) and the Commonwealth Games Uganda (CGU) registered another high and sustainable results in the promotion of Olympism and values of the shared common wealth. In 2024, the Olympic movement and ideals of commonwealth in Uganda made strides in different fronts in line with the vision, mission and values espoused in the constitution and strategic plan. At the beginning of 2024, we pledged to continue with the implementation of our Strategic Plan 2022 - 2027 along the key 5 areas of athlete development support, improving organisation effectiveness and sustainability, capacity building, business development and promotion of Olympic/Commonwealth sport value, ideals and sport agenda. In order to achieve these, we planned to take full advantage of the Olympic Solidarity programs; 3 development areas, 5 program clusters and at least 18 programs. We also kept our focus on special projects and scaling up relationships with partners to achieve our plans. The success of these were expected through strengthening secretariat operations, mandatory meetings and interface with our members.

We lived up to the bill and scored high in 2024, amplified by the performance at the Paris Olympic Games, thanks to Joshua Cheptegei and Peruth Chemutai. We continued with our journey of distinguishing the UOC/CGU as one of the top National Olympic Committees (NOCs) and Commonwealth Games Association in Africa through delivery of fairly good managerial and in-field activities. Our quest to develop sports through Olympic Solidarity support and covering all the three development Areas was achieved. We built capacity of 259 people (161 women and

98 men) in sports administration and management, interfaced with over 60 stakeholders in sports including commercial and non-commercial partners. We were able to attract substantial support in the promotion of Olympic movement in the country and the commonwealth ideals. We strengthened our relations with government to address the strategic plans and compliance is sports.

We prepared and presented a competitive Team Uganda to the Paris 2024 Olympic Games that returned with one of the best performances ever in our history; 1 Gold and 1 Silver and supported participation of athletes in Africa Games. We successfully hosted the IOC President, one of highlights of the year and Africa Olympic Values debate. The year 2024 ended on very positive note with us closing all the Olympic Solidarity files (2021 – 2024) within the timeframe, the first time ever.

Despite the relatively high achievement, we had pending targets that could not be achieved due to circumstances beyond our control; the NOC office and 2nd Olympafrica centre and Olympic forest projects, all of which are linked to acquisition of land. These will continue in the next plans. We also had one of the darkest times with the loss of Olympian Rebecca Cheptegei that gripped the whole world, bringing to life the silent evil of gender based violence, an incident that compels us to keep alert in the times ahead.

As we look forward to another sports year and a new Olympic Quadrennial (2025 – 2028), we will continue to be guided by our plan. Key on the agenda will be the review of the Strategic Plan 2022 – 2027 to incorporate the new ideas in sports and from our members. With an increase in world program fi-

4.3 Other capacity building opportunities

The UOC/CGU leadership, staff and other members attended several training sessions in 2024.

- i. Session on Sports Betting & Sponsorship organised by the Olympic Movement unit on the prevention of competition manipulation on 8th August attended by Dr. Donald Rukare. Issues related to creating awareness on illegal sports betting, adoption of regulations and cooperation with law enforcement agencies to gather intelligence.
- ii. The 29th East Africa Law Society Annual Conference on 29th November attended by Dr. Rukare and Mr. Moses Mwase as part of a panel discussing sports law in East Africa. They tackled issues relating to governance and commercialization of sport, shaping legislation and regulation, role of contracts, betting, manipulation of competition, match fixing, intellectual property and branding.

6.3.2 Secure and effective sponsoring

 With the support of the Marketing Commission, we signed and implemented MOUs with Sanlam, Next Media, Nile Breweries and Plascon for the Paris 2024 Olympic Games.

7. Special Projects

The UOC/CGU promotes Olympism, ideals and agenda on sports through special projects that target both sports and non-sports beneficiaries as well as local and refugee communities.

7.1 Game Connect Phase 2 Activities

Club Formation: April 22 - May 17

i. Structured and formed clubs between April and May 2024 in the four locations of the project i.e. Adjumani, Kamwenge, Kampala and Kikuube. The UOC through liaison officers collected data on the sports that were done in the various. Football, volleyball and netball emerged as most popular. Clubs were formed and structured across all the locations of the Project.

Sports Sessions

- The project conducted sports administrator's course for the coaches in Adjumani and Kampala that was attended by a total of 30 coaches, peer leaders and district coordinators. It also trained teachers in sports for mental health in Kikuube and Kampala.
- ii. Organised GameConnect annual review meeting that took place in Mukono. The review discussed the progress from the results of year one of the project and the

- next actions going forward to make the clubs in the locations more effective. During the event, the theory of change was also revised and the indicators of performance enhanced.
- iii. The GameConnect team took part in the Sharing Olympism 2024 at Kabojja international school that brought 6 schools and two countries to compete in poetry, essay writing, quiz, debate, and public speaking. The ORF participant emerged as the 3rd best in quiz.
- iv. The Game Connect Project held a football technical course for beginners at Hormisdallen Primary School Gayaza from 2nd to 6th December 2024.

Annual Sports Gala 2024

i. The 3rd Edition of the Annual Sports Gala in Adjumani was celebrated from 11th to 12th September 2024 where teams competed in volleyball, football and netball. The event was hosted by Right to Play with guests coming from the other consortium partners.

Other Activities

i. The project procured sports kits (40) for the peer leaders that helped with the delivery of sport for protection activities in the different locations. The kit included balls, hoops, bibs, whistles among others. It also procured branding and visibility items for the consortium. The UOC purchased pull ups, tear drops, polo and corporate shirts for the different consortium partners and they were delivered. The project further procured items for the Game Connect Annual Sports Gala that took place in Adjumani. The items procured included T-shirts, trophies, hampers etc.

7.2 Olympafrica

In 2024, Olympafrica implemented the following activities:

- i. Implemented O! Yes program through training sessions for Volleyball, Athletics, Football held in March 2024 and Local Football Tournament.
- ii. O! Yes.
- iii. Organised Olympafrica Youth Games for Baseball 5 Local Tournament, Volleyball 3 by 3 tournaments. The games started on 25th September 2024 and ended on 23rd November 2024.
- iv. Organised virtual training sessions of coaches and officials in preparation for the Olympafrica Youth Games, Baseball 5 Local Tournament, Volleyball 3 by 3 tournaments
- v. Courtesy visits by Germany University through the DOSB to assess the German volunteers who were sent

to assist the centre and by UOC staff to identify activities to be undertaken by the exchange volunteers (Mr. Tobias).

- vi. The Centre Director, Mr. Mustafa Mugerwa and Wante Mutwalubi attended the Sport for Development and Safeguarding Seminar 10th to 14th June 2024 in Samone, Senegal.
- vii. Implemented Iba Mbaye 2024 initiative.
- viii. Implemented routine outreach programs.

8. Preparation For International Games

In 2024, the UOC/CGU prepared, presented and supported teams for multi sports with the major event being the Paris 2024 Olympic Games.

8.1 Paris 2024 Olympic Games

Initially, the UOC targeted 15 federations. However, only four sports remained at the end of qualification period; Aquatics, Athletics, Cycling, Rowing and Rugby. A total of 25 athletes represented the country in the games; 13 women and 12 men, same number and gender representation in Tokyo 2020 Games. The team comprised of 21 athletes from

Athletics (qualified by time and ranking); 1 Rower qualified by ranking; 1 cyclist (road) qualified by ranking; and 2 Swimmers (qualified by universality).

At the end of the Games, the team returned with 2 medals; 1 Gold and 1 Silver by Joshua Cheptegei in 10000m and Peruth Chemutai in 3000m steeplechase respectively. Uganda was ranked 55th overall and 7th in Africa.

Prior to this, there were potential qualifiers from Rugby that participated in the final Repechage, Boxing at the World qualifier event and Badminton at Continental qualifier event. Other sports made efforts; weightlifting, DanceSport, Table Tennis, Football (Women team), Basketball 3 x 3, Skating and Wrestling. With early identification of pathways to Olympic Games, more sports can qualify athletes in future events.

8.2 All Africa Games, Accra 2023

In 2024, UOC/CGU supported the preparation and participation of Team Uganda in the 2023 Africa Games, Accra Ghana. The support included availing human resource (General Team Manager and Administrator) and payment of participation fee for Team Uganda. Thirteen (13) sport codes participated in the Games which was one of the largest teams in recent history winning 20 medals (4 Gold, 6 Silver and 10 Bronze). Uganda was ranked 13th out of 54 African countries.

8.3 Future Games

In 2024, the UOC/CGU started preparations for future games. Information for each of the Games were provided to member federations and associations.

8.3.1 Youth Olympic Games - 31st October - 13th November 2026, Dakar, Senegal

The 2026 Youth Olympic Games are scheduled to take place in Dakar, Senegal from 31st October to 13th November 2026. There will be 25 sports to be contested in at 3 major venues. The sports included Athletics, Rugby, Boxing, Swimming, Break dance, Baseball (5x5(, Skateboarding, Basketball 3x3, Archery, Cycling, Equestrian, Badminton, Football, Fencing, Gymnastics, Judo, Taekwondo, Wushu, Table Tennis, Sailing, Beach Handball, Triathlon, Rowing, Volleyball and Wrestling.

8.3.2 The XXXIV Olympiad, 14 -30 July 2028, Los Angeles, USA

Preparations for the next Summer Olympic Games has started. In addition to the usual core sports, five (5) have been added: Flag football, Baseball/Softball, Lacrosse, Cricket and Squash. The fate of Boxing will be known by end of January 2025. The UOC can leverage the current level of some of the new sports to increase the contingent to the games. Scholarship support to athletes has gone up by 16% implying better assistance.

8.3.3 The XXIII Commonwealth Games 23rd July to 2nd August 2025, Glasgow, Scotland.

The Commonwealth Sport Federation confirmed the venue for the next games. The number of sports reduced from 19 in Birmingham to 10 in Glasgow. The sports are Athletics, Swimming, Cycling (Track), Boxing, Netball, Gymnastics, Lawn ball, judo Basketball 3 x 3 and Weightlifting. The Glasgow 2026 Portal where CGAs can access documents such as Team Size Calculators, Grants, Village allocations already opened on 1st November 2024.

8.3.4 Winter Olympic Games 6 - 15th March 2026, Milan Italy.

Preparation for next Winter Olympic Games, Milan Italy is ongoing. Uganda has never participated in the Games and no athlete showed interest by end of 2024 to participate in the Games. Possibly athletes who participated in the DREAM program (Korea) (Skating) could give it a try.

8.3.5 African Youth Games December 2025, Luanda, Angola

These games were previously scheduled to take place in Maseru, Lesotho as postponed games of 2022. The Games will now take place in Luanda, Angola in December 2025, with the actual dates yet to be confirmed. The Games will be used as qualifiers for the Youth Olympic Games, Dakar 2026. Information on the sports and others regarding the Games are yet to be communicated. However, it is expected that the same sports at the YOG will take place at the continental Games.

8.3.6 6th Edition of the Islamic Solidarity Games, 6th – 15th August 2025, Riyadh, Saudi Arabia

The 6th Edition of the Islamic Solidarity Games are scheduled for Riyadh from 6 – 15th August 2025, Riyadh Saudi Arabia. 15th in 2025. Information regarding the Games are yet to be received.

8.3.7 African Schools Sports Games, Algeria from July 5–13, 2025

The first edition of African school games have been scheduled to take place in Algiers July 2025. of the Games. Although this may fall under schools sports, it could be used to identify athletes for the continental youth games.

8.3.8 Zone V Youth Games, 2025, Cairo, Egypt

The ANOCA Zone V special (informal) meeting held in Cascais, Portugal (31/10/2024) proposed to organise the long-awaited Zonal Games in February 2025, Cairo, Egypt. However, no formal information was never received. It should be noted that the Zone never organised any activity except the inception meeting that took place in Addis Ababa in 2021.

10. Financial Performance

In 2024, efforts were made to mobilize financial resources from multiple revenue streams. A total of UGX 5,091,063,538 was realized against UGX 4.4bn planned mainly from the traditional partners; IOC/OS, ANOCA, CGF and NCS for various activities. We developed proposals and shared with some partners with positive results mainly towards Paris 2024 Olympic Games. Although some of the pledges could not be realized by the end of the year, these will continue to follow as we strive to strengthen the business plan to interest more partners in 2025 and beyond.

11. Challenges

- Governance challenges in member Federations and Associations;
- ii. Potential problems in the implementation of the Sports Law:
- Lack of commitments or delays in committing support to UOC/CGU land issues so as to implement related projects; and
- iv. Inadequate financial resources.

12. Plans For 2025

The UOC/CGU will to promote Olympism and Commonwealth sports ideals in line with the Strategic Plan 2022/2027. With no major multisport event in 2025, we shall focus on:

- i. Review of the UOC Strategic Plan 2022 2027 and strengthen implementation of the pending interventions along the key 5 areas of athlete development support, improving organisation effectiveness and sustainability, capacity building, business development and promotion of Olympic/Commonwealth sport value, ideals and sport agenda.
- ii. Scale up OS applications to take full advantage of all the 3 development areas, 5 program clusters and at least 18 programs within the timelines under the new world program quadrennial (2025 2028).
- Prepare athletes and ensure their participation in Riyadh ISSA Games and preparation for Glasgow 2026

- and Dakar 2026 Commonwealth and Youth Olympic Games respectively.
- iv. Participate in assemblies, congresses, forums and meetings organised by the ANOCA, ANOC, IOC, CGF, ISSF and national sports organisations including member federations and associations.
- v. Follow up projects in pipeline; Olympic Forest, construction of UOC Head office and 2nd Olympafrica Centre and others that were not concluded.
- vi. Overseeing implementation of special projects such as ORF, Game Changers and Olympafrica in close collaboration with the NF/As.
- vii. Celebration of Commonwealth Day, Refugee day, Olympic Day and any other festivals/galas where possible.
- viii. Provision of technical, material and financial support to Federations and Associations in the development of sports sector in the country.

13. Obituary

The year 2024 had its dark sides where key sports persons, relatives and friends departed. Key among the people we lost were Rebecca Cheptegei, Olympian who suffered social injustice from one expected to protect her, Prof. Era Mugisha, a long term sports administrator in athletics and sports tutor in Makerere University.

14. Conclusion

The UOC Secretariat Report 2024 highlights significant progress in aligning activities with the UOC Strategic Plan 2022-2027. The achievements were a collective responsibility of all its member federations/associations, government and commercial and non-commercial partners. We look forward to a brighter 2025 as we open anther chapter leading to LA 2028 Olympic Games.
